In less than one year, Peggy Goad was promoted to Consumer Services Specialist with even greater responsibility for support of the program director and the counseling staff, and even served as the board liaison in support of the Executive Director after Jenni was promoted.

In September 1997, Peggy became the Program Management Assistant for sheltered employment program services and remained in that position until her brief departure from the Antelope Valley in May 2000. Fortunately for us, Peggy returned in July 2000 as a case aide within the Supported Employment Program until being promoted into a Counselor/Program Manager position in 2001. At the point of her retirement, Peggy was a senior counselor/program manager with responsibility for overall case management for consumers within the work readiness program, including admissions, discharges, counseling, goal development and related supportive services.

Peggy's retirement day was full of festivities to honor her with gifts and warm remembrances. Many of the consumers spoke as to how much Peggy meant to them as their counselor, while others expressed their feelings in song. DHE's resident "Michael Jackson" (Herman Johnson) presented Peggy with his famous glove, after performing.
